# **Parish Council News**

## **Vacancy for a Councillor**

Following the resignation of Cllr. Carl Turner there is a vacancy on the Parish Council. If you live or work in the parish and are over 18 years of age you are eligible to be co-opted onto the Council. You would be joining a pro-active group of people working to improve all aspects of life in the parish.

Recent achievements include new equipment for the play area, the establishment of a Speed Watch Group led by a resident and a new village sign for Cockayne Hatley. The Parish Council is currently working with CBC to secure an allotment site and homes to meet the need shown in the recent housing needs survey. We are also pushing CBC to fulfil their commitment to repair the road surface at the T-junction on Potton Road and the Eyeworth Road cross roads and install a speed camera there. Negotiations with the Co-op to acquire land for recreation at Cockayne Hatley are ongoing.

## **Parking on Pavements**

Parking on pavements may leave more room for traffic to pass your car, but it makes life very difficult and potentially dangerous for pedestrians, particularly those with push chairs or mobility aids. Please consider others and park your car on the road if a garage or drive is not available.

## **Dog Fouling**

The incidence of dog fouling has increased recently, both on the pavements and on well walked footpaths round the parish. Please pick up after your dog. There are bins around the parish for dog waste, please make the effort to use them.

## Wrestlingworth Burial Ground

For the first time, in order to reduce the cost of grass cutting and control the amount of council tax you are asked to pay, the Parish Council has agreed with St Peter's church that the left hand side of the burial ground will be left un-mown and only cut at the end of the season. This decision has coincided with a warm wet spring which made everything grow very quickly. We are aware that there are a few tended graves on that side of the burial ground which are currently quite overgrown. Do you tend a grave there or know someone who does? If so, please contact the clerk Mrs Catherine Dear [wrestlingworth@aol.com](mailto:wrestlingworth@aol.com) ,01767 631383 to tell her the position of the grave and the name on the headstone. This will help the parish council to decide how best to look after this part of the burial ground.



## HIKE, MIGHT AND PINT

Jim Hawkins, of the Parish Walking and Wildlife Group, tests a long, local, circular walk via Hinxworth, suggesting welcome refreshment stops along the way.

This is a 19 mile walk round Tadlow, The Mordens, Ashwell, Hinxworth and Dunton. It should take around seven hours, plus breaks. A detailed description of the walk and many more photos can be found on the PWWG website <http://www.pwwg.org.uk/walks.php>.



*Left Map of route (GMAP pedometer)* The route starts heading out east to New England farm, then onto the Clopton way for a short way before descending to the east of Tadlow, crossing the Cam at Bridge Farm and heading south on Cobbs Lane. Cobbs Lane is on top of a bank, believed to have been a Saxon boundary marker. In summer it is alive with butterflies and dragonflies.

Reaching Guilden Morden we pass through the grounds of Morden Hall then on to Steeple Morden and Morden Green, where remnants of the old Steeple Morden airfield can be seen.

On south to Ashwell Street, passing the beautiful Gatley End, we turn right and head for Ashwell. Ashwell Street runs for miles through beautiful farmland. On reaching Ashwell we will have walked 10 miles, so will have earned lunch and a pint at one of the three hostleries.

Leave Ashwell and climb Newnham Hill, with fine views of Ashwell and the Vale of the Cam.

Heading downhill we bypass Hinxworth (take a diversion to the village if you wish) and walk across the flat plain to Dunton. Crossing the road we walk down to the brook then along it to Manor Lodge and on past the Lousy Bush nature reserve to the Chequers.

After 19 miles you have earned yourself a pint.

## NUMBERS IN MY HEAD

At Primary School we called them **Sums** – adding and multiplying pounds, shillings and pence, trying to calculate curious measurements like rods, poles and perches and chanting tables! I can quote my BBC staff number from forty odd years ago 76363, my parents' old home number STOnegrove 5718 (whatever happened to those lovely old exchanges?) and all my friends' phone numbers and birthdates. # **Trial and error cooking by Gordon Blue (assisted by Egon Ronnie)**

## **BANANA PANCAKE (Serves one adult or two small children)**

This recipe is basically is possibly the most simplest I will ever come up with! This is very suitable for children taking their first steps in cooking.

### **Ingredients:-**

One banana, One egg and a sprinkling of sugar

### **Method**

Mash up the banana until it is a liquid pulp, looking as watery as possible. This will be easiest to do using a yellow banana, but for extra taste use one which is still partially green.

Then beat up the egg as if you were making an omelette. Once the yolk and white are as one, pour into the banana mixture. Stir until satisfactorily mixed and then stir in a sprinkling of sugar. Not too much though as your mixture is already fairly sweet.

Then pour everything into an upturned medium casserole dish lid and microwave until the centre of the mixture starts to rise. 3 minutes should be enough. Alternatively you could fry it in a little butter, turning over halfway through, so that in this instance it has browned slightly on both sides.

If you have microwaved it then you can eat it from the dish you have cooked it from, otherwise if fried you will need to turn it out onto a plate.

### **Egon Ronnie comments:-**

This is a really easy recipe to prepare and one which children will have fun in making. But beware in that the combined banana and egg mixture will expand on cooking, so the end product will be larger than you think.

You might also wish to consider adding a topping to the finished product. I suggest either, a dollop of strawberry jam, some ice cream or some grated chocolate. If you choose the latter option then make sure you keep the chocolate in the fridge for some time beforehand to make sure it is very cold, as trying to use warm chocolate is not a 'grate' idea!
