Children's Play Area

Following a COVID-19 risk assessment the Play Area off Church Lane has been open since mid July. We hope that users are enjoying being back in the play park after such a long break. Here is a reminder of the safety guidelines:

- If you are displaying symptoms of COVID-19 stay at home
- Wash your hands before and after visiting
- Bring your own hand sanitiser and wipes to clean your hands and equipment before and after use
- Follow current social distancing guidelines
- Only one household to use one piece of play equipment at any one time
- If others are waiting, a maximum of five minutes on any piece of equipment
- Remind your children not to put their mouths on the equipment or touch their face or mouth after touching the play equipment
- All litter, including used PPE, must be disposed of using the bin provided or taken home to be disposed of
- Supervise children while they are using this equipment to ensure they follow the guidance

A Message from Tracey Wye, Our Local Independent Central Bedfordshire Councillor

Central Bedfordshire Council allocates £2,000 to each councillor to support local groups and charities which are looking to fund “capital expense” projects, i.e. buying tangible items.

Last year Adam awarded grants for new defibrillators for Wrestlingworth and Cockayne Hatley, while my £2k went towards forest school equipment in Potton, and poly-tunnel materials for the community garden in Dunton.

There was £471 left unspent from my grant pot, which will be carried over to be spent this year - a total of £4471 for the ward.

I encourage all local groups and organisations (and parish councils and schools) to think about what grants they need, and to bear in mind the

following conditions:

- Money must go towards a capital expense; ie equipment, or materials, not anything like hall hire, or paying for an instructor.
- All grants must be 50 per cent match-funded with money which has not come from other CBC sources; i.e. the group must have half the money already that was not a CBC grant or payment

We are looking forward to hearing from groups across Wrestlingworth and Cockayne Hatley looking to fund cultural, environmental, sporting or social projects.

The Community Asset Grant scheme will be running again but due to the COVID-19 crisis the council is not able to confirm when it will invite applications.

As lockdown begins to ease up for many of us, a huge thank you goes out to all the Goodwill Fund volunteers who kept those shielding at home supplied with food, prescriptions and friendship.

Across the town and villages, friends, neighbours and even complete strangers ensured anyone who needed assistance was taken care of, and we applaud you.

I would also like to thank all those who reached out and asked for help - it doesn't come naturally to many people but its a sign of what fantastic communities we have that people were able to come forward.

As we start to look at how to return to work, it has become apparent that some people will be facing financial hardship, and find themselves in a position they never thought was would happen to them. Some may even have lost their jobs.


GOOD NEWS!

Cockayne Hatley Corner

More about Thomas Willement

I have written before about the famous stained-glass maker who has made most of the windows in the church at Cockayne Hatley. This previous article followed a visit to Hampton Lucy in Warwickshire where the altar window was even more impressive than our own east window. I was encouraged to write again having obtained a reprint of a document written in 1840 giving a list of Willement's works. The list is not complete as he continued working until 1865, but nevertheless, a number of interesting facts emerge. The booklet gives the dates of the installations at Cockayne Hatley church: The east window was installed in 1829, and the armorial windows in the chancel in 1839 – both funded by The Hon. & Rev. Henry Cockayne Cust.


Willement's first commission was in 1812 when he was aged 26. It was for a mansion in Cornwall, and was an armorial window depicting the ancestry of the owner. Willement specialized in these armorial windows throughout his career. Willement's career progression was slow at first. His next commission was in 1816 (a castle in Cumberland) and he only had 9 further commissions in his first 10 years of activity. However, his career eventually took off after 1825/1826 when he obtained 15 commissions. Between 1812 and 1840 he became famous and carried out 194 installations.

As Willement's fame grew, his customers were wide ranging, many in London but others in Wales (Penryn Castle), Scotland (Scone Palace), Ireland (Crom Castle, Armagh Cathedral), and even in the Cathedral in "Barbadoes". The last item in the booklet was the provision in 1840 of two large windows for the "new" Cambridge University Library (where are they now?)

Future plans

We hope to resume Communion Services at the church in September, and Evensong Services thereafter. "Friends" events are more uncertain. We have missed the Spring concert by the Locrian Choir and we cannot have our usual Mad Hatley Tea Party this year. Christmas concerts and Carol Services will have to wait for more information.

Whose Poo Are You?

Simon Dear, a member of the Parish Walking and Wildlife Group, shares some clues to wildlife visiting our gardens during lockdown.

“Whose poo are you?” It’s none of your business! Or so the old joke goes. But strange droppings can reveal what wildlife has been visiting your garden both by day and by night - not only birds but larger mammals too. Most animals are not too discerning where they do their business and if you look closely at your lawn and in your flower beds, you may find your visitor’s calling cards.

Here are some I have found recently in my garden. Can you identify whose poo they are? Answers are on the following page.

Please avoid handling animal faeces whenever possible, and only do so when appropriate precautions are taken, such as wearing gloves.

And always wash your hands afterwards!



Whose Poo Are you? - Answers & Explanation

1. Hedgehog are insectivores and the shell casings of their diet are usually clearly visible in their small, dark and pellet-shaped droppings.
2. Muntjac, as with all deer, are large herbivores that eat large amounts of green plants each day, and their droppings are thus large and, when fresh, often green in appearance.
3. Unknown garden bird. Dark purple droppings are due to a diet of berries, and typically left by members of the thrush family (which includes blackbirds, thrushes, redwings and fieldfares). This dropping was from the start of April near a bush where blackbirds and mistle thrushes were eating the last of the previous autumn's fruit. The seeds are clearly visible.
4. Unknown garden bird. Birds, unlike mammals, do not produce urine. Instead they excrete nitrogenous wastes in the form of uric acid, which emerges as a characteristic white paste.
5. Rabbit leave characteristic scatter of fibrous (due to high grass stalk content) and spherical droppings, and often use the same spot for going about their business.
6. Badgers dig a "latrine" - a small excavation about 150mm deep and wide - in which they deposit their dung. The latrine may be used by more than one badger from the sett.

PWWG Update

During this year's wheat harvest in August and September, spare a thought to yesteryear when wheat and wheat straw were gathered semi-mechanically, as the above photo shows. The photo is from the 1920s. It must have been back-breaking work. The local population peaked in 1871 due to a boom in market gardening in the area, and declined thereafter due a national agricultural depression which was at its height between 1871-81.

Time Out for the St Peter's Church Clock

If you've noticed the absence of clock chimes from the Church of St. Peter over the past week or so, it is because - after 47 years of more-or-less continuous operation - the time has come for some essential repairs to the bell clanger, and weights' pulleys that drive the clock mechanism and chimes. The clock itself is in perfect working order, but it needs to be stopped for a few weeks while the restoration work is carried out.

As we go to press, work is expected to start on Friday 24th July with the removal of the worn parts, which will be taken to the workshop of Smith of Derby to be stripped and restored before being returned to Wrestlingworth for recommissioning around mid-to-late August.

We don't yet know the exact date when the clock's chimes will be heard again over the parish - but have no doubt, you will hear the familiar sounds again soon!

Trial and Error Cooking by Gordon Blue (assisted by Egon Ronnie)

A CLASSIC SALAD (Serves one person)

This recipe is a form of protest! We don't eat out that much, but when we do many of the meals we order come with what is known these days as salad. In fact, 'salad' with some meals is often seen as a replacement for vegetables. Not only that but because of this the price can get bumped up. For example, you may ask for a cheese sandwich, but it comes with salad.

For me the worst case of misrepresentation came when we were on holiday in Devon a few years ago. Salad was on the menu, preceded by some fancy name which I have forgotten about. So, I went for it, expecting to be served up with something similar to what I am about to present to you below. But what I received was nothing like I expected. In it were hints of finely chopped cherry tomatoes, peppers and cucumber, but apart from that for all intents and purposes it appeared that the 'chef' had been out into the fields adjacent to the pub, picked up a handful of grass and weeds, put them into a blender for about twenty seconds along with the other items and then tipped them onto a plate and then sprinkled some form of tangy dressing over it and called it a salad.

So, in protest I present to you a classic salad, similar to one which we used to have every Sunday night when I was a kid. I do hope that you enjoy it. The meal is for one person, but when you purchase most of the items you need for it you will find that there is enough left over for several meals. Do remember to wash all items which do not come in packet form before using them.

Ingredients:-

4 baby new potatoes	2 or 3 radishes
2 slices of cooked ham	3 or 4 mini pickled onions
1 tomato	Half of a Sweet Gem lettuce
4 or 5 slices of cucumber	2 tablespoons of cottage cheese
2 baby beetroot	Heinz salad cream
3 or 4 spring onions	Slice of bread and butter

Method

Firstly, cook the potatoes. Place them in a saucepan of boiling water. Bring to the boil and then simmer until cooked. Check regularly until they are ready.

Then choose what kind of salad you want. This one is a ham salad, so put one or two slices of cooked ham in the centre of your plate. Next cut up and quarter a tomato and place on the edge of the plate. Then next to it placed the cucumber, peeled if desired. Then as you work your way round the plate add

the beetroot. Next top and tail the spring onions removing the non-edible part before placing the tail part towards the centre of the plate, so that they can be picked up at the top end. Then top and tail the radishes. Slice them in half before placing them next to the beetroot. Then add the pickled onions. Then top and tail the lettuce and cut in half top to bottom. Save the other half for future use. Place this on top of the ham, allowing the outer leaves to become detached if they do. Then add a couple of tablespoonsfuls of cottage cheese next to the lettuce - or a small amount of any cheese of your choosing. Finally add the cooked baby potatoes.

Then add as much salad cream as you wish. For me it must always be Heinz, but of course other brands are available! Finally, a personal favourite. As you eat your meal, ensure that you leave one crunchy bit of lettuce until last. Place this in the bread and butter, perhaps with some more salad cream, fold in half and eat, using the bread to wipe up the various juices left over from your meal, so that by the end you have a clean plate!

I am sure that you have fond memories of this meal, prepared by your mother when you were a kid Gordon. Of course, apart from ham, your base could be almost anything. Cheese, pilchards, hard boiled eggs spring to mind, but this must be so refreshing to eat on a hot summer's night.
